Pilgrims Progress

Centuries ago church leaders developed a method of celebrating the life and ministry of Jesus throughout the year called the Christian calendar. This calendar is overlaid on the Roman calendar which is based on the rotation of the earth around the sun; our common way of tracking days and months on a twelve month cycle. Complicating these calendars is the use of the Jewish calendar, a lunar calendar, for some of the fasts and feasts, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. Of course, the events on the Christian calendar do not coincide day for day with either the Roman or Jewish calendars. Are you thoroughly confused? You are not alone.

The New Year on the Christian calendar this year began with Advent, November 28th, the fourth Sunday prior to Christmas. The Christmas season, anticipated throughout the four weeks of Advent, finally arrived and now suddenly has ended twelve days later on January 6th. Church leaders, in an effort to co-opt the Roman celebration of gods, selected December 25 as the birth date of Jesus. They wanted to demonstrate something more powerful than the worship of the sun was important. So at the time when the winter solstice began (December 21, they miscalculated the date) when the sun began to shine longer each day, the church leaders arbitrarily selected the date for the birth of Jesus to coincide with the "birth" of the sun.

The Star of Bethlehem has been depicted in art as part of the Nativity scene for centuries. It is usually seen as a very large and very bright star resting just above the location where Jesus had been born. And the Christian feast day, Epiphany, is celebrated as the day that this star had finally led the Magi from the East to the child Jesus.

Epiphany, celebrated on January 6, falls on the last day of the Twelve Days of

Christmas. It is a time when the Western Christians observe the visitation of the Magi, and Eastern Christians observe the baptism of Jesus, both as manifestation of Jesus as the Son of God.

The worship season of Epiphany extends from January 6th to Ash Wednesday (March 9th this year). Epiphany means a sudden manifestation of the essence or meaning of something. An epiphany is a spiritual flash that changes the perception one has of reality. The focus of the New Testament readings for worship during this season is the ministry of Jesus. The purpose is to highlight events in the ministry of Jesus that serve as epiphanies. The meaning of epiphany related to Jesus is a sudden awareness that the meaning and message of Jesus' life was for all people, Jews and Gentiles alike. Thus began the expansion of the meaning and purpose of the Gospel or the good news of God embodied in the life and ministry of Jesus. In the bulletin each Sunday between now and Ash Wednesday you will see the phrase "Epiphany is a season recognizing the revelation of God in the life and ministry of Jesus" to help communicate the meaning and purpose of the Epiphany season of worship. I look forward to seeing you in worship throughout this season as we explore the relevance of Jesus' ministry for our lives and for the ministry of Glenview Community Church.

Our sympathy and prayers are for June Lamb, former member of Glenview Community Church, who died on December 27th in Houston, Texas where she had been living since 2007.

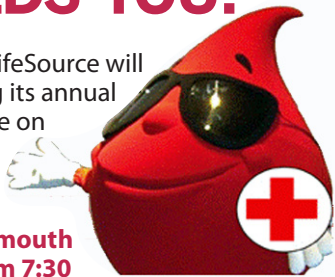

LECTIO DIVINA

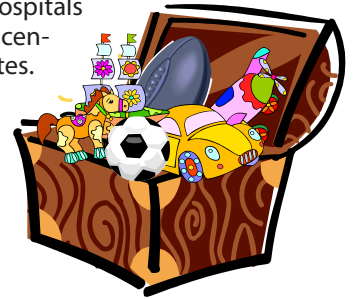

The Night Ministry is a very worthy agency that GCC helps to support. In addition to providing shelters for teenagers, they run a bus that serves homeless and street people 6 nights a week. There visitors come in for warmth, counseling, HIV testing, to visit with a nurse and are always given a hot beverage. As they leave the bus, they are given a package

of 3 cookies, kind of a symbol that somebody cares about them. On average they give away about 1,200 cookies a week!

Our cookie gifts mean a great deal to the folks who receive them. Our church members bake the cookies and the PYF and 678 Club put them into packages of 3 and deliver them. Thus, this is an all church hands-on project.

You can never bake for a more worthy cause. **Home-made cookies are always greatly appreciated**, but if you buy cookies, OREOS are preferred.

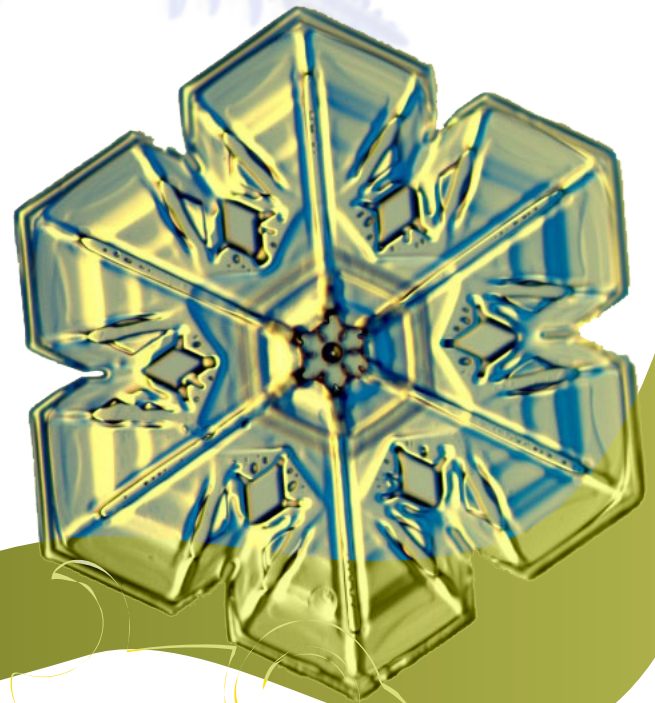
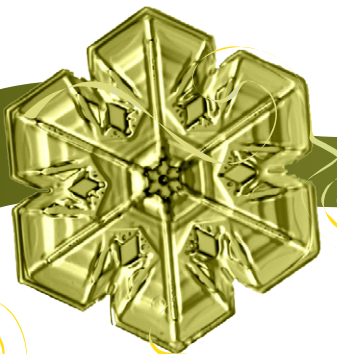
