

THE ORGAN

No matter how much forethought and planning are invested in a construction project (especially one as large as ours), there are always surprises. In our case, we've been surprised a number of times because the several installments in our building's construction (1946, 1950, 1955, 1959, 1970, 1999 and 2003) means that a good deal of what exists was not built according to plan and creates unanticipated consequences. This has been especially true of the electrical system; something that supremely frustrates our electrical contractor every week.

One of these surprises is that our wonderful pipe organ has been significantly impacted by an infiltration of construction dust, even though there is no construction directly in the sanctuary. Nevertheless, the dust from the demolition migrated throughout the building and found its way into the organ. And, since the dust is primarily from masonry and concrete it is both abrasive and corrosive. That makes cleaning the organ time-sensitive. It is an intensive project that involves removing, cleaning and regulating each of the nearly 3,900 pipes, opening, cleaning and lubricating each of the wind chests on which the pipes stand, and washing the entire organ and the chamber where it is housed. At its meeting last Tuesday evening, the Spiritual Council approved the first phase of a comprehensive organ cleaning. Berghaus Pipe Organ Builders of Bellwood, IL has already removed several sets of pipes from the instrument for disassembly and cleaning. With Gary Wendt's excellence as an organist, most of us will not be aware of their absence. We are hopeful that the entire cleaning will be completed

this summer.

Berghaus emerged as the organ builder of choice for this cleaning from among three builders that responded to our request for evaluation and information. **Berghaus** is enthusiastically recommended by each of the several references that were contacted. Its local (Bellwood) location also provides the advantage of proximity to their shop that will support this project.

This work is being done as a part of our construction project; not as an upgrade for our music ministry. Coincidently, the 20th anniversary of the installation of our **Buzard Opus 21** pipe organ will be this coming October. So, though we would have not undertaken this cleaning now without the impact of our construction project, our organ will be clean and like new for its landmark birthday.

For 20 years GCC has been blessed by the majesty of one of the finest pipe organs in the Chicago area. It is GCC's single most valuable physical asset, recently assessed as having a replacement cost of \$1,863,000. This cleaning is the most significant stewardship of our organ since it was installed. It will maintain, protect and secure our wonderful pipe organ for decades to come. And it will both thunder and whisper heaven's glory with inspiration that no other musical instrument can match as we worship and praise our awesome God. See you in church!


