A Pilgrim's Progress

I suspect each of us had some emotional deflation following our Easter celebration. We left the Easter service excited, emotionally high, uplifted, feeling life was grand and we could face and deal with anything that came our way.

But now, just a couple of days later, many of us have a "let down" feeling. Our lives feel like they are at low tide. We are not alone and not the first people to experience this. Actually, this has been the emotional experience of people from the very first followers of Jesus. We have a comrade, a colleague, and a fellow struggler in Thomas.

Thomas has gotten a bad rap through the years. Because he raised questions and was unwilling to take the other disciples words as first hand experience for himself, Thomas has been identified by many as a doubter. Actually doubt is a helpful and healthy approach because it causes us to examine things closely and carefully. As one person has stated, "Doubt is the mother of faith."

I have found Thomas to be a wonderful role model of faith. A week after the resurrection when Thomas met with his fellow disciples, they were excited and energized because they said, "We have seen the Lord." But Thomas couldn't celebrate because what they were telling him was not real to him. Thomas had enough integrity not to say he believed something when he didn't. Thomas did not argue with his fellow disciples. He simply stated that he would not believe until he had seen Jesus for himself. What was it that Thomas would believe if he saw and touched Jesus? Was he saving he will believe that Jesus is alive? Had the very foundation of his life been so shaken that he doubted God and only by seeing and touching Jesus would he believe in God again? Maybe he was saying that life had lost its meaning and to see and touch Jesus would give him the opportunity to believe in life itself.

A week later when Thomas saw Jesus, Jesus instructed him to do exactly what Thomas

said he would have to do in order to believe. There is no indication that Thomas did that. All that is recorded is Thomas' exclamation, "My Lord and my God!"

For Thomas, seeing was believing. Jesus said that even happier are the people for whom believing is seeing. Has that ever happened to you? Has believing ever led to seeing for you? Many parents have had the experience of believing in a child, believing strongly enough and long enough until they saw in the child what they had believed was there all along. Teachers believe in students until they see students bloom. Coaches believe athletes have talent that will develop. God believes in us even when we don't believe in ourselves. And we believe in one another. Our belief in one another brings out the best in them and us and the believing becomes seeing. Believing Thomas not only leads to our seeing, but also leads to our recognizing what a wonderful contribution Thomas has made to the faith with his questions, his struggles, and his open, honest inquiry. Believing Thomas has enabled me to question, search, learn, and grow. Believing Thomas has led to seeing, to seeing glimpses of truth God has for me. I commend Thomas to you. You'll find him to be a kindred spirit.
