Tuesday, May 25th was Election Day at GCC. The Annual Congregational Meeting was held at 7 p.m. in the Mayflower Room. During the meeting Lloyd Bettis was elected to serve as Moderator, Bill Dailey as Vice-Moderator, and Constance Filling as Immediate Past Moderator. Also elected were new members of the twelve boards who will help us minister throughout the year. Constance Filling shared summary remarks about the past year from her perspective as Moderator. A major item of business was a decision on the Open and Affirming Policy Statement presented by the ONA Committee. Over the course of four years the ONA Committee explored the meaning of becoming an Open and Affirming Congregation and provided numerous educational events to help congregants learn and be informed about this issue. The motion was presented on behalf of the Committee by Jason Ornduff. Two members spoke to the motion. The vote was by secret ballot with 127 voting in favor of the statement and 10 opposed. The statement clearly upholds the slogan we use regularly, "No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome at Glenview Community Church."

The church program year spans the time between annual congregational meetings. So, we are officially into the 2010-2011 Church Program Year. The newly constituted boards will have their first meetings in June. A Leadership Retreat that includes members of the Executive Board and vice chairs of all boards is planned for August 28th. The Planning Committee is urging all boards to work collaboratively to fulfill our vision statement, "A strong community of Christian faith that welcomes and engages all people in personal and spiritual growth," and our mission statement, "Learning, loving, and serving in God's name." To fulfill these two statements, boards are encouraged to work together to help the congregation reach its goals: engage members, extend mission, expand membership, and achieve financial stability. To help the congregation maintain focus on these statements and goals, the staff has developed a theme for the year, enthusiastically supported by the Planning Committee, Embrace the Vision, Live the Mission. Throughout the year worship services, educational opportunities, mission endeavors and service projects will be developed to communicate this theme and help us as a faith community to be unified in our worship and service of God.

Members of boards, Women's Association chapters, and Men's Ministry are vital to the ministry of GCC. They can help strengthen our ministry as they plan each event by asking, "How does this event help us live out the theme, Embrace the Vision, Live the Mission?" May we have fun, strengthen relationships, and develop new friendships as we engage in personal and spiritual growth learning, loving, and serving in God's name. May 2010-2011 be a fantastic year when all of us embrace the vision and live the mission of Glenview Community Church. May there be progress for all us, individually and collectively, during this church program year.
