BLESSED TO BE A BLESSING



This was the **Summer of Sabrina**. Sabrina came to us on January 15, 1999. At the Bay Area Humane Society in Green Bay, she was the jet black kitten who nuzzled our necks and stole our hearts. Always the shy kitty, she disappeared for most of the day, taking shelter under the living room sofa. When the doorbell rang, she disappeared into the bowels of the basement, coming out for food only when she was certain that the house was rid of the threat of visiting humans. She was never quite certain about me, and nearly always ran away when I approached her during the day. But, when night came and I was safely horizontal under the covers, she'd grace me with a visit, cuddling in the crook of my elbow. There was never any naughtiness from this midnight feline, save her passion for bread. Unless the bread was locked away in the microwave or the refrigerator, she'd find it and chew her way through the bag to satisfy her

A year or more ago Sabrina began to suffer with kidney failure. She needed supplemental fluids, and we learned how to administer them. When we were on our way to the annual meeting of the UCC Illinois Conference in June, our pet sitter summoned us home. Sabrina was limp and lethargic, falling asleep with her head in her water bowl. The next morning we took her to the vet. We were nearly certain that she'd never come home again, but the vet

was more optimistic. She gave Sabrina a shot of vitamins, and Sabrina responded. But the shadow-black cat who was afraid of her own shadow was afraid no more. She greeted us at the door...and guests as well. She befriended the Hands of Peace Israeli young man who we hosted in July. Every ten days or so she'd begin to fade, but another booster shot would perk her up. Sabrina was a cat transformed. It was almost as if she was saying, "I know my time is short, so I'm going to live every moment to its fullest."

The vet cautioned us that this revitalization wouldn't last forever...that it was the last of Sabrina's nine lives. "When she stops eating, that's the end," she said.

She stopped on Sunday, August 31st. No amount of coaxing or variety of delectable delicacies could make her change her mind. She was done. So, on Thursday, September 4th, Sabrina left our house for the last time, but she will never leave our hearts.

For us, this was the *Summer of Sabrina*. We cancelled our plan to be away for 2½ weeks in August. We just couldn't leave Sabrina for that long. Instead, we made three short trips, with the last one cut short by a fractured toilet tank that flooded our house...a toilet that Sabrina led our pet sitter to as soon as she walked through the door. We had 2½ months of grace with Sabrina this summer, and each day was a blessing. What a gift!

So here's the lesson of Sabrina: recognize the blessings in your lives...and then be a blessing in the lives of others. This summer, Sabrina seemed to know what we can easily forget: each day is grace...each day is a blessing.

GLENVIEW VILLAGE BOARD ON FAIR HOUSING

On September 18, the Glenview Board of Trustees will hold a workshop on the fair housing provisions of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance. The workshop will begin at 7:00 P.M. in the downstairs Board meeting room of the Glenview Village Hall, 1225 Waukegan Road.

Speakers from the Housing Authority of Cook County and Cook County Planning and Development will discuss the Housing Choice Voucher program, and the Trustees and public will have time for questions and comments.

In August, 2013, the County Board amended its Human Rights Ordinance to prohibit landlord discrimination against people whose rent is partially paid with housing choice vouchers. The Village of Glenview continues to promulgate the false concept that this amendment requires all landlords to accept vouchers. Glenview is the only entity in the county to have responded to this amendment by passing a village ordinance specifically permitting discrimination against people with vouchers, making it more difficult for lowincome people to rent in Glenview than in other locations in the County.

Delegates from the Faith in Action Team plan to attend the meeting to show their opposition to discrimination based on source of income (vouchers.)
