

CHANGING LIVES

Decades ago, a clever adaptation of John 3:16 that made its way to a number of church signs. It goes like this:

God so loved the world that he didn't send a committee.

I've heard that cliché affirmed by several recently retired clergy as they reflected on their pastoral careers. Some say that they miss preaching and leading worship. Others say that they miss making pastoral calls. And still others say that they miss working with children and youth. But none of them say that they miss the meetings!

Somewhere in the dusty annals of mainline Protestantism, meetings were elevated to an essential holy place in the life of the church. The church can't do its business without meetings. Even more than that, meetings aren't just necessary for ministry; they are ministry...even though many more people than retired pastors see them as tedious and even dreadful! Perhaps that's because our meetings are too often dominated by discussion and disagreement that are rooted more in secular opinions and perspectives than they are in spiritual convictions that are rooted in the love of God in Jesus Christ.

All of this is a prelude to an inspiring experience I recently had...at a GCC meeting! In the conversation that we were sharing at that meeting, one of the participants said this:

This church has changed my life.

Yes, sometimes God surprises us when we least expect it...even in a meeting! Those six words went straight to my heart and inspired me and reminded me that changing lives with the love of God in Jesus Christ is the cornerstone and the compelling purpose of the church. It's the goal of our Message, of our Ministries, and of our Mission. And when God is using us to change lives, then this *House for ALL God's People* is growing the promise of *A World for ALL God's People*.

But sometimes change doesn't feel like good news. Instead of change, sometimes what we most want is constancy. We long for comfort, not challenge...congratulations, not courage. But as much as solidifying our stasis may be our desire, change is at the heart of our religion. God called Abraham to come out of his retirement and become the patriarch of a new nation. God called Moses to lead Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land. And, most significantly for us, Jesus called ordinary people to become extraordinary disciples by leaving their old lives behind and following Him. It's not a stretch to say that we can't be faithful unless we're changing and growing.

Several weeks ago God surprised me when I walked into the church office. A person I'd never met before was waiting to talk with me. My experience is that strangers who want to talk with me usually need food, or gasoline, or medications, or a train ticket, or rent money. But that wasn't true this time. The person who was waiting for me wanted to talk to me about becoming a Christian! This person was hungry to learn about Jesus and the life of faith that follows Him. In thirty-six years of ministry, this is

only the second time I've had this request. The first came from someone I knew – our Jewish neighbor when we lived in St. Louis.

I want to become a Christian! Teach me about Jesus! These are the kind of requests that pastors dream of while we're consumed by the business of the institutional church and the work of caring for and feeding our congregations. So the gift of this ongoing conversation brought me home to the gracious reality that the business of the church is changing lives with the love of God in Jesus Christ.

In our 75th anniversary celebration, I hope to focus on this cornerstone as we ask two questions: How has GCC changed lives for the past seventy-five years? And how will GCC change lives in the years to come?

As we focus on those questions, remember also a phrase from the last verse of Charles Wesley's great hymn, Love Divine. It goes like this:

Changed from glory into glory, till in heaven we take our place.

May we each experience the joy of having our lives changed by God's love...and may we all experience the fulfillment of sharing God's love that changes lives. *This church has changed my life!* Let those words be often heard at GCC. See you in church!

One of the most venerable and most influential differences that long separated Christianity and Buddhism lies in the centuries-long discussion of the respective merits of a life of contemplation versus a life devoted to active service to the community. the needy, and the larger world. Can the deep inner spiritual life and the life of active compassionate service exist in isolation from each other? Or is "spiritually motivated social engagement" the ideal to which the seeker should aspire? In recent years, the two traditions have, in many respects, begun to converge.
