

BENEATH THE SURFACE

It's very interesting – even fascinating – watching the progress of the demolition in our construction project. As plaster comes off the walls...as ceilings are pulled down... as floors are stripped of their coverings the stories of our church building that have been hidden so long they've been forgotten are being rediscovered. We're finding doorways that were abandoned... windows that were once larger or smaller... large electrical conduits that were either abandoned or never filled with wires...stairways that were narrowed to accommodate heating pipes...and many other curiosities in our church home. Because our facility was built in four major stages across 13 years (1946-59), there's a lot that was never noted on the plans. For decades it's lived beneath the surface, so now we're digging for buried treasure!

In a recent sermon I referred to Peter's words from his first letter:

Come to Jesus, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

The point of that passage is that we are the building blocks for God's spiritual house, just as steel and wood, bricks and stone are the building blocks for God's physical house. And, as it is for physical houses, there's a good deal about us that's hidden; that's beneath the surface.

We know that that's true in criminal investigations, so we dig for evidence that

unearths what we've buried. But there are also the more poignant things that live beneath our surface...graces and griefs that we keep hidden in the sanctuary of our hearts.

We humans are complex beings. Each of us is the beauty of unique individuality that is born when our flesh of the earth is inhabited and animated by the Spirit of God. No one else fully and truly knows us as we know ourselves...except for God who knows us through and through.

The point is that, in this life, what we see is NOT what we get! So, building this Spiritual House for ALL God's People means living with one another gently, encouragingly, forgivingly, expectantly, kindly, courageously, trustingly. The more we become vulnerable with one another... the more we honor and dignify God's humanity...the more we will feel safe to reveal to one another the substance of our souls and the breath of God that lives within us.

The substance of our souls that is inspired by the Spirit of God...or, as Peter calls us, *living stones*. And we can't build *A House for ALL God's People* without all the stones...without you.!




8TH GRADE CONFIRMATION MINI-RETREAT
