

THE PLAN

As promised last May at the Annual Meeting, I said I would share my plans sometime in the fall about the time-line for my remaining ministry at GCC. It's taking time to look at one's history, remembering those stories and people that are still with us in our souls. And then looking ahead to what could be or may be, not knowing for sure.

As of January 1, 2019 I prepare to transition my ministry to half-time. Half-time ministry for a pastor is about 20-25 hours per week, or 5-6 units per week. A day is made up of three units: morning, afternoon, evening. My commitment is to work 5-6 units per week. For example, Sunday morning, Monday all day, and Tuesday afternoon and evening. This, of course, may change, depending upon my schedule, funerals, UCC meetings, etc. It might be good to call or email if you want to meet me, rather than just dropping by. It will be strange and different, as I've only done full-time ministry for 27 years, on call 24/7. But I think it should work well.

From January through May, 2019 I will continue the half-time hours. My final 8th grade Confirmation Class will be confirmed in May. Then, I will be on sabbatical from June 1 through September 30 (making up for one that was missed when Chuck first arrived). I don't have definite plans yet, but hope to share them later next spring. Part of my time will be working on a specific project for the future of the church.

When I return October 1, get ready for a big party! I've chosen a worship and celebration time for Sunday, October 20, 2019. This is the date closest to when I was first installed

at GCC, on October 22, 1995. There will be many ways to rejoice together that weekend.

October through December, 2019, I will continue my half-time work, and, also, clean out shelves and files, and sort through all those books! My ministry at GCC will conclude on January 3, 2020.

It feels strange to write all of this on paper, but I like the plan. I'm still in a good place. I still have ministry and work to do! I may not know what's next, but God is with me.

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT OCTOBER 23, 2018

At the October Spiritual Council meeting, GCC's very active Ministries shared their news, and the Construction Committee reported good progress.

Pastors' Reports: Elizabeth reported on the continuing engagement of the youth and children in PYF, the Wednesday evening programs, and church school. Planning for the mission trip to Birmingham is underway, with active participation from the youth. Pam attended the meeting of the Chicago Metropolitan Association of the UCC and heard some good ideas about environmental responsibility and e-giving that she has shared with the relevant Ministries and Teams.

Construction Update: Construction has caused some disturbances, such as fire alarms and the occasional power outage, but the work is proceeding well and expected to be completed on our target dates.

Treasurer's Report: Year to date, we are about \$67,000 ahead of budget. Pledge fulfillment is slightly under budget, but non-pledge contributions have been strong.

Generosity: The Generosity campaign is off to an energetic start. Letters have been sent, and pledges have started coming in. At the time of the meeting, the Generosity Team had received 90 pledges, totaling approximately \$315,000.

Welcoming a New Business Administrator: GCC has hired a new Business Administrator, who will take over the job after Dale Wittenberg retires at the end of the year. Lucinda Fuller has many years of experience as a corporate and church business administrator, and she knows GCC well because she sings in the choir. Be sure to welcome Lucinda when you see her in the office or the choir loft!

SAFETY INFORMATION

A "Safety Information Meeting" was held recently for all head ushers, ushers, teachers, ambassadors/greeters of the church. Thanks to Steve Gale, Brian Tidwell and Bill Roenitz for organizing and leading this session about the latest safety information and procedures in the church. Chief Usher Bill Roenitz has also put together an Usher Guidelines which will be available to all of our ushers. During the construction months, each usher team will provide an usher to stay in the transept area to help negotiate stairs, directions, etc. If you would like to be on an usher team, please let Rev. SUMMARY: We are \$70,628 better than budget through September. Our approved budget defines an annual deficit of \$79,779, so if the balance of the year holds plan, we will end 2018 with an operating deficit of \$9,151.

LIFE EVERLASTING

We trust the promise of the resurrection for GCC member **Dorothy B. Faierson**, who passed away one month shy of age 105, on Sunday, October 21, 2018, even as we hold her son, **Dr. Richard Faierson** and family in our prayers. A celebration of **Dorothy's** life was held on November 3, 2018 at Chestnut Square at The Glen.

MISSION PARTNER HIGHLIGHT

Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) is a Christian non-profit organization dedicated to feeding children nutritionally complete meals with the hope of eliminating starvation. Kids and adults come together to hand-pack meals designed to improve the lives of malnourished children. These meals are then donated to partners around the world, which include schools, orphanages, churches, or malnourishment centers.

This will be GCC's 5th year of packing food for starving children. Our church has packed over 146,000 meals in the past 4 years, which translates to feeding 400 children for an entire year. **FMSC** produces a meal for 22 cents and feeds a child for an entire year for only \$80! Over 90% of donations are spent directly on meal production.

Melissa Aki was blessed with the opportunity to travel to Nicaragua to see the **FMSC** food in action. When visiting a school that receives the Manna Pack Rice meals, she was able to help serve lunch to a classroom of 5 and 6 year olds. These schools do not have enough money for plates and cups. If a child forgets to bring these, they do not get their meal for the day. One little boy ate some manna pack rice and then put a cover on his bowl and put it in his backpack. Some of Melissa's group were concerned that he didn't like it and asked him why he didn't finish his lunch. This little boy told them he needed to take the rest home to give to his little sister otherwise she wouldn't have anything to eat. This is the type of children you are feeding when you pack meals.

We encourage you to join the GCC packing day on Saturday, December 15 from 2-4 in the afternoon at the **FMSC** site at 742 E. Park Ave, Libertyville, IL. This is a great family activity; anyone 5 years old and up is able to volunteer. Also, feel free to invite friends and family members to join our church community for this fun packing event.
