

PREPARING WHILE WE PREPARE

Grandma's house was a little two-bedroom, pink brick ranch. One high school summer Grandma told my cousin Mark and I that the trim on her house needed paint and that she'd pay us to do the job. We'd never tackled a real painting project before, but it sounded like fun so we agreed. Grandma took us to the local paint store. We told the proprietor about our project and asked him how much paint and how many brushes he thought we needed. But he didn't answer us. Instead, he had questions of his own: Do you have scrapers? No. Do you have wire brushes? No. Do you have sand paper? No. Oh, and you'll need a gallon of primer, too. What do we need these things for? Well boys, the most important part of a good paint job isn't brushing on the paint. It's the preparation. Grandma didn't say a word, but she was smiling. Mark and I learned an important lesson that day, and what we thought was a few days' work turned into a whole month of our summer. But that paint job lasted for years.

Painting Grandma's house taught Mark and me a foundational life lesson. Nothing important or worth doing well can be accomplished without careful, thoughtful, ample preparation. We live in an instant

Christmas culture. Christmas begins full blown in early October now with ubiquitous red and green, and endless Christmas music filling our stores. In this culture, preparation means buying all of the right presents, baking all of the sweet treats, decorating the house and trimming the tree, shipping all of the packages, and writing all of the Christmas greetings and getting them in the mail so that all of our friends and family members who we connect with once a year receive them by Christmas Eve. It's a frantic scramble. And then, on December 26th, it's over...and we're exhausted and perhaps feeling disappointedly empty.

The inertia of this rush toward Christmas with all of these external trappings and preparations is nearly irresistible. In the midst of this frantic scramble that's wrapped up in manufactured sentiment and grandiose gift-getting expectations, the church offers us the incredible grace of Advent. Advent means coming, and it requires preparation. But Advent preparation is just the opposite of a frantic scramble. It's the simplicity and leanness of time for the internal preparation of reflection and prayer...gifts that prepare our hearts to receive the magnitude of the gift of God's perfect love in the newborn human package we call Jesus, and to give Him to the world with who He makes of us and how we live in response. Changing our lives...seeing signs of grace and peace in the midst of grief and violence ... claiming the full authority of God's call to us and daring to become partners in God's salvation: these are the things that truly prepare us for Christmas.

So join us as we prepare. This Sunday we will focus on John the Baptist; one of the most unlikely elves you'll ever meet. On December 23rd, we'll focus on Mary – not meek and mild, but defiant and determined that her son will change the world. Then, when we have prepared our hearts, we will come to the manger on Christmas Eve.

CHRISTMAS OFFERING

This year's Christmas offering (envelope enclosed) is concentrating on homelessness. The recipients will be **Cornerstone Community Outreach** and **La Casa Norte**.

Cornerstone Community Outreach provides shelter and finds homes for families and individuals who are at the greatest risk of being excluded from necessary services. They provide nutritious meals, safe shelter, and supportive services, especially for homeless seniors age 50-65 who are not eligible for social security and are compromised by poor nutrition and severe living conditions.

La Casa Norte serves youth and families confronting homelessness. They provide access to permanent, transitional, and emergency housing to help families and individuals toward stability and selfsufficiency. They also provide programs in life skills, technology training, education support, and employment readiness.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE; 11/27/2018

There is still a little ongoing demo as things progress. The staircase from the Narthex balcony to the basement should be completely gone last week. This makes room for the elevator shaft to continue being erected. As of today the shaft is up to the first floor. Once the shaft is completed the elevator rails will be installed. The elevator is scheduled to be delivered on February10, 2019 with installation completed by April 7, 2019.

ELECTRICAL

General electrical piping and wiring ongoing for the next several weeks in all areas of construction.

HVAC

Sheet metal and mechanical will be installed over the next 3 weeks in the Narthex balcony, stage and choir rooms, along with the area outside of the elevator.

Furnaces for the remodeled areas will be installed and a gas lines run to the fireplace and furnaces.

PLUMBING

Rough plumbing is complete in the fist floor men's and woman's bathrooms, is almost complete in the 2 family bathrooms and work is scheduled to start in the lower level men's room behind the new elevator.

Storm drain work is scheduled to be completed by mid-December.

STEEL

The steel structure for the first floor is underway scheduled to be completed next week. The upper commons steel structure is in place, roof and deck should be completed by mid-December.

Roofers are scheduled for December 17. All areas should be water tight by Christmas.

Windows in the Mayflower room have been changed from a double-hung window to Marvin Tilt Turn. This was done as a code requirement for square footage of fresh air intake.

The Altounian crew and TKWA have been very diligent about keeping this schedule on track. We couldn't have selected better companies to work with. *Nick*

The Night Ministry is a Chicago-based nonprofit that provides housing, health care, and human connection to individuals experiencing homelessness or poverty. With an open heart and open mind, we accept people as they are and address their immediate physical, emotional, and social needs while affirming their sense of humanity.

How We Help

The Night Ministry served **5,660** individuals last year.



1,760 free health assessments provided last year.

Health Care

The Night Ministry's Outreach and Health Ministry Program brings accessible health care to individuals and families who might be unable or ineligible to receive services elsewhere. **The Health Outreach Bus** brings free medical care, food, hygiene supplies, and supportive services to underserved Chicago neighborhoods six days a week. **The Street Medicine Team** visits encampments, parks, and street corners across Chicago, supporting individuals who have the most trouble accessing traditional services.

Housing

For many homeless and precariously housed youth, The Night Ministry provides a vital first step toward safety and improved circumstances.

Youth Engagement Services

The Night Ministry's Youth Engagement Services meets and builds relationships with young people experiencing homelessness across Chicago. Our **Youth Outreach Team** helps young people living on the streets or at-risk of becoming homeless while **The Crib** provides young adults with safe and supportive overnight emergency shelter.

Early Intervention Services

Early Intervention Services at the **Response-Ability Pregnant and Parenting Program** and the **Interim Housing Program** offer young people and their children safe and nurturing short-term housing in an environment that fosters stability, responsibility, and independent living skills.

455 young people and **34** of their children housed last year.

Long-Term Residential Services

Long-Term Residential Services at The Night Ministry's **Transitional Living Program** and at **Phoenix Hall** provide housing and intensive life skills coaching to young people. The Transitional Living Program offers up to two years of housing for young adults while Phoenix Hall serves North Lawndale College Prep High School students experiencing homelessness.
